

Flip'em Rules

Game 1: War

- Shuffle all of them and randomly divide the Flips evenly among those whom are playing.
- Each player reorders their Flips and sets the side they want seen on top.
- Each player takes the Flip that is on top of their pile.
- Each player flips or tosses their Flip in the air at the same time.
- Each Flip lands on a flat surface.
- The player that has the highest number wins.
- If the highest number that is tossed is a tie; the (tie) pile is set aside and the winner of the next toss wins the tie, as well. If more than two are playing; if the next toss is not won by one of the two that has the tie; the pile that is set aside in a tie is then won the next time one of the members of the tie wins.
- The one that wins all of the Flips; WINS!

Game 2: Challenge

- Each player owns their own Flips.
- Each player chooses five chips to lay in front of them, deciding which side to show the other players.
- One of the players starts by choosing the first Flip they wish to challenge the other players. (Slide it towards the other players, again not revealing the backside.)
- The other player(s) choose the Flip that they want to use to challenge.
- The players agree to the challenge.
- If any player does not agree to the challenge that toss is not played.
- Each player flips or tosses theirs in the air at the same time.
- Each Flip lands on a flat surface.
- The player that has the highest number wins the right to keep the others Flip.
- Play continues until no more challenges are made. The players leave with the Flips that they won.

Game 3: Threes

- Typically two player game.
- Each players starts with three points.
- Randomly divide the Flips evenly among the two whom are playing.
- Each player sets the pile to one side.
- Each chooses three chips to play; in front of them, deciding which side to show the other player.
- Each player flips the highest numbered chip they have displayed, at the same time.
- Each Flip lands on a flat surface.
- The player that has the highest number wins those chips. If one person wins all three chips (in that set) the other person losses half of a point. If the person who wins all three has a chip with a three on it the other persons loses another half a point (total of one point).
- Any chips that are won are set to the other side until all the chips are played at least once.
- Play continues until one player wins all of the chips or one player has no more points.
